



#### Criminality and the Asbestos Industry

- Profitability based on minimizing costs of prevention and compensation
- Asbestos Industry propaganda contradicts international consensus that all forms of asbestos cause cancer and should be banned, and that no level of airborne asbestos exposure is safe (WHO, ILO, asbestos bans in 55 countries)
- Asbestos market depends on public ignorance of the dangers to workers, consumers, and the general public
- Asbestos Industry cover-ups of the deadliness of asbestos stretch back to the 1930s
- Asbestos Industry expanded in developing world after 1970

### Asbestos is Like Tobacco

- WHO (OMS) on tobacco:
- There is a fundamental and irreconcilable conflict between tobacco interests and public health policy interests
- Governments should interact with the tobacco industry only
  when and to the extent strictly necessary to effectively regulate
  the tobacco industry and tobacco products
- For Asbestos the same conflict exists between marketing the product and killing people, this is a criminal industry
- Governments should ban asbestos now and regulate exposure to in-place asbestos products no one is addicted to asbestos
